

In April, we visited South and North Carolina, where some of Keith's ancestors were from.

First, we visited the Neil Culbreth Cemetery in Roseboro, Sampson County, NC, where Keith's 4th and 5th great-grand-fathers on his father's side (Alexander, 1782-1860 and Neil himself, 1740-1828) are buried.

Then we traveled to Darlington, South Carolina which was the original home of Keith's maternal great-great-grandfather, James Goodwin Wallace. He was a surgeon in the Civil War (Confederate side, 10th SC Regiment, Co. K) and relocated to Florida after the war apparently as part of a program the US Government had to populate Florida and relocate Yankee and

Confederate soldiers alike.

We didn't find much new information at the [Darlington Historical Society](#), but when visiting the [War Between The States Museum](#) in Florence, the proprietor helped us locate [Roseville Plantation](#), where James' father had been overseer. We visited the plantation (now in Florence County) and the current owner let us walk around the property. It was an amazing moment for Keith to stand on the very land his great-great-great grandfa-

ther stood upon 160 years earlier.


Then we ventured up to Chatham County, North Carolina where another ancestor hailed from. James K Polk Emerson (1845-1920) also fought for the Confederacy, and ended the war in Point Lookout Prison (Maryland). He also relocated to central Florida after the war. We had been in contact with Keith's 7th cousin John Nash for a few months, and we were so happy to meet up with him and his wife. We visited the grave of James Emerson ([The Regulator](#), 1735-1786), our common ancestor, who had fought in an uprising against the British prior to the Revolution. This James was


If you have an interest in going, I would not recom-

He loves the down home soul food, even hog maw.


He thinks driving there and taking the old two lane highways is the way to heighten the whole experience.
